London Central (Bolsover Street) Youth Hostel 2008 to present

104-108 Bolsover Street, London W1W 5LP Historic County: Middlesex

The YHA website Supporters' eNews announced in December 2006 that work had started on the new flagship property for the city centre, YHA London Central. Work necessitated the conversion of a former office block on Bolsover Street into a modern large youth hostel. The block dates from 1959. At first used as offices, it operated as the Students' Union building of the Polytechnic of Central London / University of Westminster from 1972 to 1998, and was vacant for a period after that. It was comprehensively refurbished and reclad in 2007 for YHA, initially with 296 bed spaces planned. The premises are leasehold.

The hostel opened on 6th February 2008. After some internal reconfiguration and the replacement of staff quarters in the basement by further guest rooms, the capacity is now [2017] about 300. The basement also contains the self-catering kitchen and some utilities. The ground floor holds a large reception, café bar, lounge area, utilities and guest rooms, including disabled facilities. Floors 1-5 are almost identical, being devoted to guest bedrooms.

By its fourth year, Central had broken every British record by being the first youth hostel to top 100,000 overnights in one year.
